Project description	Data reveal only 1 prosecution for every 2,154 female victims of sex trafficking globally (2020). Greek northern borders are one of the main Europe's backdoors for sex traffickers, while Greece has been convicted twice for violating the Art. 4 of the ECHR in cases of sexually exploited women victims of THB. The A4 Project builds upon the Convictions under the Art. 4 aiming to enhance perpetrators' accountability for the protection of women and girl victims of sex trafficking through a police-led resilient mechanism in the EU south-eastern border, built on a border-crossing alliance (Bulgaria-Greece) constructively interconnected with an interregional safety net (5 Northern Greek Border Regions) and advanced from the acquired knowledge of a central European country (Austria).

In addition, a promotion video will be developed with the express purpose of engaging stakeholders and the general public as well as raising awareness for human trafficking, the A4 Project and its findings. The video will be subcontracted based on a best-value-for-money approach and its design will involve key stakeholders and human rights experts to secure a dignified and sensitive presentation of the topic. It will be used in physical and virtual meeting contexts, as part of the A4 online campaign and beyond the project's lifetime.

Deviations & Mitigation

D5.8 was rescheduled to adjust to the overall implementation of the project to M29. Consequently, its focus was adjusted to serve as promotion of the major outcomes of the A4 project, specifically the A4 Practice Guide and the A4 Policy recommendations. To achieve this, it was decided to develop two separate videos, dedicated to each key result. The videos are designed to contribute to the sustainability of the project beyond the projects' runtime.

INTRODUCTION

The A4 project decided in the course of implementing WP3 and WP4 to develop two videos dedicated specifically to the two outcomes sustaining the project. For the A4 Practice Guidance developed through the WP2 desk research activities, specifically the focus groups on existing needs among frontline practitioners, as well as the trainings and workshops in WP3 and WP4, as well as the A4 Policy Recommendations, it was decided to develop two teaser videos which can be used for further dissemination of the project beyond the project runtime.

The WP leader VICESSE contracted an external video designer and developed the videos between M26-M29. The videos have been premiered at the A4 Final Conference on 29 Aug 2023 in Athens. VICESSE and the consortium will disseminate the videos beyond the projects' runtime in subsequent projects on THB.




Figure 1. A4 Practice Guide (Video Screenshot)




Figure 2. A4 Policy Recommendations (Video Screenshot)
