Executive Summary

One of the key initiatives of the LEAGUE project was the successful organisation of two international training sessions in Vienna in February and September 2023. These sessions were strategically planned to bring together child rights and child protection experts from across Europe and from different professional and educational backgrounds, with the dual aim of enhancing their knowledge and fostering a professional network for sharing experiences. The economic timing of the sessions, during off-peak periods, ensured cost effectiveness in line with the consortium's budget considerations. The training used materials developed by the consortium, marking their first official validation. This initiative contributed significantly to the project's impact and reach across Europe, as evidenced for instance by participants' engagement on social media and mentions in newsletters.

1 Introduction

This deliverable provides an overview of the organisation and delivery of the two international training sessions of the LEAGUE project in Vienna. With this approach, the LEAGUE project has embarked on an ambitious journey to reshape the landscape of children's rights and child protection. This story unfolds through the careful realisation of two pivotal international training sessions, meticulously planned and implemented under the banner of the LEAGUE project. These sessions, not just meetings but places of knowledge and collaboration, were held in Vienna, because it is essentially in the heart of Europe and therefore easily accessible to most of the consortium members and participants.

The story of these trainings is one of convergence and synergy, bringing together experts from different academic and professional backgrounds from all over Europe. Each participant, bringing a wealth of experience and insight, contributed to an enriching dialogue aimed at deepening and broadening the understanding of children's rights and protection. The venue of the training provided the perfect setting for these meetings, allowing ideas to flourish and professional networks to be strengthened.

As we delve into the details of these trainings, particularly through the compilation of materials (annexes), we see a careful blend of strategic planning and focused implementation. At its heart, the LEAGUE project is a story of commitment and impact, with the promotion of a professional community and the dissemination of knowledge at its core.

2 Organisation of the Trainings

2.1 First International Training

The first international training took place on February 16, 2023. The recruitment of participants started around the beginning of December 2022. The recruitment process was mainly facilitated by promoting the training on the project's social media channels, inviting participants through mailing lists, personal invitations to professional acquaintances of the project partner and targeted invitations to professionals and experts across Europe, mainly through a thorough research of the participants' professional profiles. The venue, catering and accommodation bookings were carefully managed throughout the organisation process. The activities carried out with the participants were taken from the LEAGUE training material. The main idea was to form groups with people from different countries and professions and to

create an interactive and lively discussion from different perspectives. These discussions were followed by a short presentation of the main results.

2.2 Second International Training

The same organisational approach was followed for the second international training, which took place on September 26, 2023. Recruitment of participants started at the beginning of June 2023. Due to the summer holidays, it was not so easy to reach potential participants so quickly. It should also be mentioned that there were more last-minute cancellations due to the occurrence of COVID-19 cases in the autumn. In addition, there was a presentation on the topic of AI-generated content and its impact on children and young people, and two presentations on the main results of the LEAGUE project (report on the child-friendly features of the internet

platform and the LEAGUE chatbot), delivered by the consortium. These presentations were followed by Q&A sessions and discussions between the participants.

The agenda has slightly changed due to feedback, gathered during the first international training session (more informational inputs and discussions, less activities).

Individual Factors Participants Mention

Social isolation \rightarrow no family/protection.

Children with disabilities are particularly vulnerable \rightarrow low self-esteem children might take different roles); no perceptions regarding the issue of sexual abuse; also, physical factors \rightarrow parents play a crucial role in their lives.

Family Factors Participants Mention

Punitive parents, parental divorce \rightarrow conflicts, children are trying to escape them (negative atmosphere at home \rightarrow lack of respect for each other; Level of education might also prove a family factor \rightarrow specialized education; proper sexual education.

Benefits in Recognizing Signs of Child Sexual Abuse Participants Mention

If you know the risk factors it is easier to compile risk profiles; it is possible, for instance to identify their age through their profiles and who they are friends with (classroom) it is also important to strengthen awareness activities also for parents \rightarrow fight against online child sexual abuse through education.

Multidisciplinary approach \rightarrow often when police is involved \rightarrow children are lying; close cooperation between the police and NGOs hast to be fostered/might be useful.

Signs in Child's Behavior That May Indicate Sexual Abuse Participants Mention

Change/shift in personality; age → it depends on how to respond to the incidence of (online) child sexual abuse.

Symptoms and Signs Participants Mention

Variable → often depends on gender; strategy could be to build trust/love; symptoms towards a person also differ depending on their specific relation to each other; there might be differences in symptoms disclosure towards mother/father.

<u>12.15 – 13.15 Brainstorming on Digital Consent - (group exercise), Module 3, A.3</u> LEAGUE Training Materials

What is consent according to the participants?

Definition of what is right for you/right for me, listen to each other and respect each other's consent; especially vulnerable in this regard are disabled people.

Consent in online contexts and situations – experience and opinion shared by the participants.

Receiving photos of private parts \rightarrow Do you want to open it? Is consent already given simply by sending photos of private parts? Nude photos are always associated with big scandals \rightarrow we are not prepared for such situation, which happen in a digital sphere, because laws are simply not suitable; digital matters always undergo a slow process; How can I prevent somebody from forwarding my private pictures?

Terms of use should be clear in this case \rightarrow misperceptions of lifestyle; Positions have always to be taken.

Taking pictures during sexual acts \rightarrow no chance of giving consent.

Digital consent could be used in terms of manipulation \rightarrow creating a feeling of guilt; boys are in this regard not seen, girls more often.

Examples of respectful online spaces with consent

Teach society \rightarrow do not practice role modelling; Consent starts with taking the picture \rightarrow however, you are always allowed to change your mind. What benefits do you have by sending these pictures? \rightarrow Would also post the online/on your social media?

A.6 – Case Studies

Case study n. 1: Moderator's observations on participants feedback on the questions

More concrete definition of religion; in case of OCSA \rightarrow that often makes a difference; "somehow the news got out" \rightarrow to vague information; Who am I? Which role do they play? What is your role within a certain relationship (regarding school environment, family)?

Cultural competences → understand the person; make him/her feel safe; not his/her fault; not him/her to blame; language barrier? Bias → TRUST!

Case study n. 2: Moderator's observations on participants feedback on the questions

Clear understanding of the situation; support system \rightarrow parents, teachers; especially teachers, person who is supposed to be in charge is often not the right person; LGBTQIA+ representation in the UK for instance \rightarrow important role of schools; planning of next step, when incidences of abuse are occurring \rightarrow ideally involvement of the child; resources where you can ask this questions \rightarrow Who am I?; Risk \rightarrow multi-hazard.

Case study n. 3: Moderator's observations on participants feedback on the questions

Reaching out to the school \rightarrow what can be done without the parents' consent; Police \rightarrow immediate elimination of risk \rightarrow maybe also the first contact in some cases.







The Limiting online sexual Exploitation and Abuse Gender based violence on Underaged boys by Educating experts - LEAGUE is a project aiming to prevent sexual abuse of boys aged 10-18 online:

- 2 years duration
- implemented into two main streams:
 international and national training programmes
 elaboration of an Internet Platform and Chatbot

Two main target groups:

- responsible actors for preventing as well as reporting online child sexual abuse focused on underaged boys, and
- boys aged 10-18

The international trainings are organised with practitioners on the field who work with children, and specifically boys who might have suffered from sexual abuse and/ or exploitation online. Case studies on the importance of creating healthy and safe relationships to prevent sexual abuse and exploitation

Objectives

To reflect how to behave in a situation on child sexual abuse representing different scenarios.

Small groups exercise Duration:

Scenario 1



Iman

Iman is 14 years old, and he is a second-generation immigrant from Syria. He comes from a conservative family and is the youngest of his four siblings. Although Iman's level in Greek language is satisfactory, he has not yet been able to establish substantial friendships with other Greek-speaking students. He, along with the rest of the refugee children, is marginalised by the students' community because of his nationality. Nevertheless, he enjoys playing football and is also a very good runner.

Iman is gay but because of his conservative family background and discrimination he has been facing as a Syrian in a Greek school, he decided to hide his sexuality. He is afraid that his sexuality will upset his family, drive his friends away and make him the laughingstock of the whole school. Iman had been online texting with an older guy (16 years old) and has admitted to him that he is gay and would like to go out on a date or to simply ask a few things about homosexuality. Somehow, the news got out and a boy from Iman's classroom started bullying Iman at school about his homosexuality using verbal, psychological and physical abuse.

It is Friday afternoon, Iman has just got back home from football practice and plays on his phone. Suddenly, he receives a text message from an unknown number. It is one of Iman's classmates who claims to know everything about Iman's sexuality and threatens to tell everyone about it.

Message on screen: "I know your secret! If I see you tomorrow, you will suffer."

- 1. What would you advise Iman to do?
- 2. Have you ever faced or observed a similar situation? What actions did you take to resolve it?
- 3. Create an alternative ending to this scenario.

Scenario 2

Emma Holton



Emma Holten was just 17 when her life changed. She woke up one morning in 2011, completely unaware that the night before during a party with her schoolmates at home, some guests had hacked her email, changed the password and leaked the new password online. They were able to access and poke around in her email and Facebook accounts. Someone found some private photos that she had sent to a boyfriend.

When Emma woke up the following morning, her nudes were online. After a few hours, an anonymous message asks her to privately send nude photos telling her that if she does so, the online photos will be deleted, perpetrating to Emma what is known as sextortion.

- 1. What would you advise Emma to do?
- 2. According to you, which strategies could prevent this situation?

Scenario 3

Katjia



Katjia has feelings for Tim, an older boy that attends her school. Tim is the most popular guy in school, and he is a big hit with the girls. He knows Katja has always had a thing for him so one day he decided to text her. Katja is thrilled to text with him but at one point the conversation starts to make her feel uncomfortable. When the conversation starts being intimate, Tim decides to send Katjia sexually explicit videos and sexually images online without Katja's consent. Despite Katjia now answering in a detached and cold way, Tim does not stop sending unwanted images.

She would like to ask him to stop sending those photos and videos, but she is afraid that if she asks for it, he won't write to her anymore and he will tease her with his friends.

- 1. What would you advise Katjia to do?
- 2. According to you what's wrong with Tim's behaviour?
- 3. Imagine a final scenario to solve this situation.

The League e-Platform

General Information

- It was developed to deliver information about the League project and the topic of online sexual Exploitation and Abuse for underage boys.
- It allows for a seamless information exchange, through a dedicated forum component.



General Information

- The aim was to create an interactive Chatbot to asses children with information regarding online harassment cases.
- Act mostly as a guidance regarding prevention and reaction measures.
- A fully-functional chatbot application was integrated on the existing e-Platform.
- The chatbot is able of understanding a user question expressed in free-text, regarding a series of supported topics, while also response in a relevant manner with useful information.

User Interface

The chatbot is integrated and launched on the official League Website.



The core data

- The chatbot is fully depended on a series of pre-defined Question-Answer (QnA) pairs.
- The QnAs have been manually collected and tailored for the purposes of this project and they form the actual knowledge of the chatbot.
- The supported questions belong to the topics of Cyberbullying, Online Grooming, Sexting and Online Safety while also questions about various Terms or Technical topics are also supported.
- They are pre-stored in a Knowledge Base (KB).



How it works

- A user types a question.
- The input question is processed through a Natural Language Understanding (NLU) module to recognize the target user intention.
- A Semantic Similarity Search mechanism examines the semantic relatedness of the input question, against all the questions from the pre-stored QnAs in the KB.
- The pre-defined question that is the most similar to the input user question is identified.
- The answer aligned to that pre-defined question, is given as a response to the user.



Additional Components

- A Chitchat Module to enrich the existing chatbot content and render the communication more fluent.
- A Fallback Handler, to cope with cases of incomprehensible user questions.
- A Multi Turn Handler, to render the chatbot aware of the previous conversation context.

Additional Components - Chitchat Module

- With this module the chatbot can understand and answer on a variety of daily life topics.
- Such topics might concern **simple greetings** (e.g. *hello*, *good bye*, *thank you*, etc.) or other **generic topics** (e.g. *who made you*, *how can you assist me*, etc.)

Additional Components - Fallback Handler

- The Fallback Handler is responsible of resolving cases where a user asks for a question that is
 incomprehensible by the chatbot.
- At first, the handler will prompt the user to rephrase the asked question in a more relevant manner.
- In case of two consecutive incomprehensible questions, the handler will pause the conversation
 thread and all the available chatbot topics, will be demonstrated for the user to manually select
 one.
- A button to immediately execute the Fallback Handler during any point of the communication has also been developed.

Additional Components - Multi-Turn Handler

- Before entering the fallback state, the multi-turn handler will be executed.
- The multi-turn handler keeps a history of the conversation thread.
- When enabled, the handler examines the semantic relatedness of the target incomprehensible question, with the last 10 questions which were previously asked by the user and were understood by the chatbot.
- If one previously-asked question, that is semantically relevant to the target asked question, is found, the chatbot asks the user whether the intention is to learn about the target topic of that previously-asked question.
- In case of an affirmative answer, a response for that question is given, otherwise the Fallback Handler is executed.
- In this way, the chatbot may cope with follow-up questions that are related to the previous conversation topics.

Evaluation

- Exhaustive application testing.
 - For each pre-stored QnA.
 - For a series of free paraphrases, using each of the pre-stored QnAs as a question basis.
- Exhaustive interface testing.
 - For each of the module separately
 - For the application as a whole.
- For the moment, the quality of the chatbot responses could only be empirically tested.
- Response time with a mean of 2 seconds for comprehensible and 5 seconds for incomprehensible questions.
- The chatbot will be properly evaluated when disseminated to the end-users.

Conclusion

- We have presented an e-Platform, dedicated to the necessities of the project, along with a taskspecific user forum.
- We have presented an interactive Chatbot to asses and guide children with information regarding online harassment cases.
 - Given a **user question in free-text**, that is relevant to a **variety of supported topics**, the chatbot can **response accordingly.**
 - An additional module to enrich the communication process with daily life topics, has been implemented.
 - A series of handlers have been developed to take under consideration the conversation history and handle a scenario of incomprehensible user question.

- The number of online Child Sexual Abuse Material crimes is difficult to measure as online content can easily be hidden or very difficult to identify.
- Due to rapid technological advancements children, and abusers, send inappropriate images, lie about their identities and conspire for potential crimes which also led to a noticeable increase of reported cases of sexually exploited or abused children.
- During COVID-19 pandemic these numbers increased.
- EUROPOL has outlined the pandemic measures such as travel restrictions
 prevented offenders from physically abusing children, therefore, the nature
 of the crime was transformed, mainly, into online sexual abuse.
- The online aspect of this crime means that there is an additional dimension that has to be considered when analysing the effects on the victims.
- Despite the fact that the online child sexual abuse does not assume physical interactions, it can damage children psychologically and physically for their whole lives.






Social Media Sites or Apps Used by Children, by Age












- The 'game' starts when someone sends the letter X to another child, that person then replies with the name of the victim.
- All players must then try and come up with as many insults as possible about the victim targeting their weight, appearance and personality.

Megan Evans and Nyah James, both 14, killed themselves after being bullied over Snapchat, according to their heartbroken mums.



Worst Reported Consequences of online games

Rolblox

- Has an average of 55.1 million daily players
- Thanks to the nature of the platform allowing anyone to upload content at will, as well as the lack of in-game moderation during interactive experiences, virtually anything goes during gameplay

The average age in the game as being 34 to 36 years old and these role playing rooms popping up where kids are asked 'you play the mom, I'll be the dad' or 'you play the doctor, I'll be the nurse'



Worst Reported Consequences of online games

The Blue Whale Challenge

- Social media challenge that encourages children, teenagers & other users to perform specific tasks, over the course of 50 days that are assigned to them by an anonymous "group administrator."
- The tasks escalates throughout 50 days and on the last day of the challenge the only way to "win" is to die by suicide.

A total reported 170 deaths by suicide.




