## **Duration:** 1 year.

## Fee:

Higher education in Sweden is free for students coming from the European Union (EU), the European Economic Area (EEA) and Switzerland, so these students do not need to pay the application fee nor tuition fees. For non-EEA students: The cost for full-time studies in law is SEK 90,000 per year, the application fee is SEK 900. There is no application fee for students coming from the European Union EU/EEA and Switzerland.

## **Application information:**

Applicants to the Master's degree programme must hold a university diploma in laws or an equivalent foreign law degree of at least 120 (180 ECTS) credit points (a three-year-degree)

The English language entry requirement is the equivalent of English studies at upper secondary (high school) level in Sweden, called English Course B/English 6.

Applicants whose first language is not English are normally required to take a Cambridge test (IELTS test) or a TOEFL test (Test of English as a Foreign Language). A score of approximately 6.5 (with no part of the test below 5.5), on the IELTS test or 250 on the Computer-based version of the TOEFL test, 600 on the paper based version or 90 on the Internet Based TOEFL test or the equivalent, is required for admission.

## Admission requirements:

All applicants must complete their application with the following:

For a complete application to Master's degree programme at Stockholm University your application **must be supported by the following documentation**, sorted in the same order as this list. The documents shall be stamped and signed **copies** and these documents are to be sent to University Studies in Sweden in Stroemsund, not to the university/universities you have applied for.

- Cover sheet
- Certificates and diplomas from previous education at an internationally recognised higher education institution (**N.B.** Students who do not hold the required degree, but are registered for the last semester of a programme leading to such a degree, may be accepted. **An official document** stating that they are likely to be awarded the degree by the start of the programme **must be sent in with the application**.)
- Transcripts of completed courses and grades (including course list). Sort them in reverse chronological order, i.e. the most recent on top (**In addition**, certain countries have specific documentation requirements see information given here <u>https://www.universityadmissions.se/intl/start</u>)
- Proof of English language skills
- Proof that you meet the specific entry requirements:
- A statement of purpose (1-2 pages where you state your reasons why you want to take part in the programme you have applied for)
- Two letters of recommendation (from professors, relevant employers etc.)
- A curriculum vitae (CV) in English (to create the Europass CV <u>click</u> <u>here</u>)
- A copy of the page in your passport with your personal data and photograph or some other document of identification

Sort the documents in the same order as stated in this list and send them in one envelope to the address stated on the cover sheet.

*Please note:* Please, only submit the required documents that are listed here above. Sending in multiple sets of documents will not increase your chances of being offered a place. This will only create problems and delays in the processing of your application due to the large number of pages of documents that must be reviewed.
