**Duration:** The programme has four main building blocks: three course blocks, and a four-week (research or field) internship. Each **course block** takes three weeks (fifteen modules of three hours), followed by a five week period to complete a task, in which either the students' research and writing skills will be tested, or a 'skills module' will be prepared and developed. This structure should allow professional participants to combine the course with their professional activities.

**Fee:** The tuition fee for the programme Postgraduate Studies in ICT & Media Law is € 5600. This fee does not cover accommodation, food or books.

## Application information:

Admissibility to the programme will be assessed on the basis of an examination of the full applications by the programme's selection committee. To apply send:

- completed application form (http://www.law.kuleuven.be/icri/psiml\_application.rtf);
- A copy of your diplomas and transcripts of academic records;
- Two references from academics, practitioners or other individuals who are familiar with your work or academic results;
- A motivation letter, clarifying why you want to participate in the programme;
- A proof of proficiency in English, for non-native speakers. Certificates accepted by K.U.Leuven are the TOEFL certificate and the IELTS certificate.

### Admission requirements:

Participants are required to have obtained a Masters degree (or equivalent) in Law. Exceptions may be allowed on the basis of specific circumstances and after an

evaluation of the participant's background, level of knowledge and experience and skills.

# Part-time participation in the Postgraduate Studies in ICT & Media Law programme

It is possible to participate in the programme on a part-time basis, spreading the programme over two years, with a more or less equal amount of credits for each of these two years (for instance: the two first course blocks in the first year, and the third course block and the internship in the second year). #### Required presence in Leuven

Although residential study is recommended (access to the library's facilities, contact with faculty, tutors, the education coordinator, and fellow students...), it is only explicitly required to be physically present in Leuven during the three intensive course blocks, which each lasts three weeks (first course block in October; second course block: mid-November; third course block: January / internship: February-March - subject to arrangement).
